

- Groups of health care providers work together to deliver a full and coordinated continuum of care for patients, even if they're not in the same organization or physical location.
- OHTs have been initially working together to improve care experiences and health outcomes for their identified Year One target patient populations and are now starting to build towards integrated care for all patients in their attributed populations.

Enable the full potential of our health human resources


- Optimize the roles and functions of health human resources across our OHT.

### Population Health Management

- Frailty Assessment
  - Early identification of individuals at risk of frailty



- Mental Health & Addictions
  - Mapping services to identify gaps
  - Early intervention for those with mild to moderate depression

### Digital Health



- CND OHT submitted or was included in the submission of 6 successful funding applications, one of which was used as a template for other OHTs submitting applications for similar projects.
- These projects brought more than \$330,000 in additional funds to support digital health in our community.
- Grant to primary care practices to support virtual care.

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### Engaging with CND Communities
